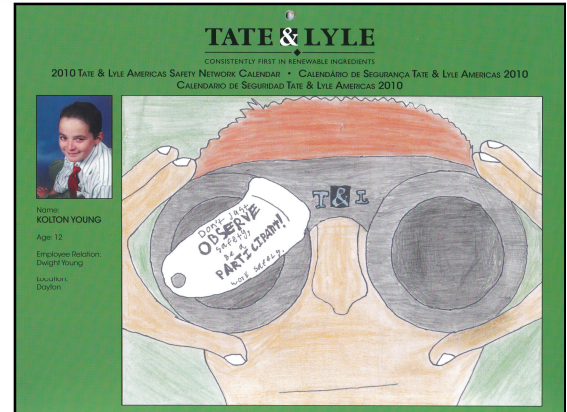

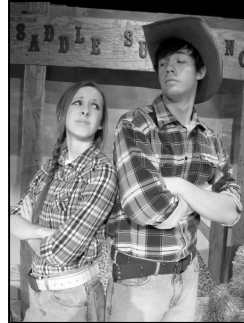
MCS Finds Free Money

The Varsity Golf team ended a very successful season with a fourth place finish. The team compiled a record of 35 wins and 4 losses with a perfect 12 and 0 record for the regular Metro-Buckeye Conference season. Highlights included a 19 and 1 regular season record, 1st place in both the Monroe Invitational (Weatherwax) and MCS Invitationals (Brown's Run CC), 2nd place finishes in the MBC tournament and the Northridge invitational, 3rd place finishes in the Waynesville tournament, the Brookville Tournament and the Sectional Tournament. The team was ranked as high as 4th in the Cincinnati area coaches poll. Brooks Curry was the low individual not on a team for the District tournament and will play the 2 day State OHSAA golf tournament on the OSU's Scarlet course on Oct. 16th and 17th. Last year he was part of the MCS team that finished 11th in the state tournament and he finished 6th overall as an individual. He is hoping to finish higher this year.

Volleyball

Congratulations to the junior high volleyball team on a terrific season! They went 20-2 in regular season and went on to win the Metro Buckeye Conference Tournament. In

Basketball-Varsity

The boy's basketball team finished the season with a nice tournament run. In the sectional semi-final the boys played Cincinnati Country Day. Down by 8 points with 3 minutes to play, the Eagles were able to mount an incredible comeback to win. The Eagles were led by Daniel Balsbaugh who recorded 25 pts. (4 three pointers), 13 rbd., 3 assists, and went 7 for 8 from the line. Zach Henderson chipped in 11 pts., 5 rbd. & was also 7 for 8 on ft's. Nate Cox had 12 pts. (3 three pointers). As a team we were 15 of 17 from the ft line in the 4th qtr. to pull out a thrilling 59 - 58 win to put us in Sectional Final.

The boys did lose in the sectional finals to a Lockland team that advanced to the regional semi-finals. Some more game details: Country Day seemed to be in command after running off 13 straight points and moving ahead 49-41 with 4 minutes showing. It was still an eight-point affair (51-43) when Balsbaugh stepped to the line to shoot three foul shots with three minutes left. Cox buried a 3-pointer to pull MCS even at 53-53 with 1:10 remaining, and CCD was called for a foul down low on the play. Henderson then converted both ends of the double bonus, and Middletown Christian led the rest of the way. The Eagles kept making free throws (15-of-17 in the fourth period) and built a 59-55 advantage. Khan nailed a trey with 1.5 ticks left for the final margin. The Cox 3-pointer was Middletown Christian's lone field goal of the last stanza. "We were inconsistent with our free throws early in the year, but here lately we've done real well," Davis said. "We devote a lot of time to it."

Wrestling

Joe Gerard had quite a season this year. In sectionals, he placed 1st in the 215 lb weight class by pinning Tyler McIntosh from Preble Shawnee in 3:07. Joe is the 1st MCS student to win the sectionals. Joe also won the Middletown CCD & the Deer Park Invitational. Joe finished the season with a 25-5 record.

Blake Wheeler was also on the wrestling team & has done well also, finishing the season with 17-9 record.
